

Stanton BB sweeps Corner Tourney

The Stanton Viqueens were crowned Corner Conference champions for the third consecutive year in a 40-34 win over Sidney on Friday, Jan. 21, and the Stanton Vikings defeated East Mills 38-31 on Saturday, Jan. 22 to return to the top. This is the second time in three years and in Stanton school history for both teams to reign over the Corner Conference Tournament, as well as the only team in the conference to accomplish this feat twice.

The Viqueens rallied from a 15-9 first quarter deficit to a 22-21 half time lead. Each team added four points only in the third period. The Queens remained calm and focused and drained eight of nine free throws

in the final period to pull away for the win.

The Vikes increased the lead by an additional bucket, heading into the final frame leading 29-25. The shooting turned cold for both teams, going half of the period scoreless before Stanton's Carter Johnson drained a trey for the largest lead of the night at 32-25. The Wolverines got within two before the

Vikes sealed the win at the line.

SWV's Ady Lundquist places third at IWCOA girls state wrestling

The Red Oak Tigers wrestling girls and Southwest Valley Timberwolves wrestling girls competed in the IWCOA girls state wrestling tournament in Coralville on Friday, Jan. 21, and Saturday, Jan. 22, representing the area well.

SWV's Ady Lundquist was ranked number one in her weight division of 110, and she brought home a third-place medal.

Lundquist went 6-1 at the tournament with four falls (:53, :59, 2:46, 1:59), and one decision (7-0) to earn the bronze.

Teammate Madeline McCoy finished the tournament 3-2 with three falls (1:29, 1:06, :24) and did not place.

Red Oak girls finished 101st of 179 teams with 15

points. Waverly-Shell Rock won the team tournament with 219 points, followed by Colfax-Mingo with 159.

"It was a terrific showing for our ladies as we attended our second girls state tournament," Red Oak head wrestling coach Tiegen Podliska said. "Unfortunately, Tymberlee Bentley was unable to compete as she was injured earlier in the week."

Ashley Schmid just began wrestling two weeks ago, and went 0-2 and did not place.

"She showed a lot of guts and competed hard," Podliska said.

Nicole Bond went 3-2 with two falls, one major decision, and did not place.

"She was right in every one of her matches," Podliska said. "She put up a lot of points and will use this experience to fuel her training."

Josie McCunn went 3-2 with one fall and two decisions, and did not place.

"Josie is the pioneer of our girls wrestling program," Podliska said. "I don't know if any of the others would be in it this year if she didn't join an all-boys team last year. She set her expectations high in attempting to get to the second day of the tournament, but fell just short."

"I would say all of our girls were happy, but not satisfied with their accomplishments."

Bond earns gold

Red Oak's Dawson Bond was one of 14 champions crowned on Saturday, Jan. 22, at the finale of the 67th annual John J. Harris Tournament in Corning.

Bond has been runner-up the past two years, and was able to claim gold his third trip to the tournament.

"Dawson had two really solid controlled matches where he set the pace and the offense on day two," Red Oak assistant wrestling coach Nathan Rouse said. "When Dawson gets to the positions he wants to be in, he is really tough to wrestle. It was fantastic to see him take the title this season."

The Tigers had five grapplers advance to the second day of the tournament, with the other four failing to qualify after day one.

"This is one of the toughest and deepest tournaments in the area," Rouse said. "When you are a young team at a tough tournament like this, you sometimes get drawn into some tough matchups, and we did. However, this team has a lot of fight and we really battled with some of those kids."

As a team, the Tigers finished in 12th place with 54.5 points.

IGHSAU sanctions girls wrestling as 11th sport

The IGHSAU board of directors voted unanimously to sanction girls wrestling as the organization’s 11th sport. The vote was made at the IHGSAU’s January board of directors meeting and was announced prior to the start of the championship round of the IWCOSA Girls state wrestling tournament in Coralville on Saturday, Jan. 22.

To date, 58 schools have committed

to sponsoring girls wrestling programs in Iowa. The latest data from Trackwrestling.com shows 1,018 girls participating in high school wrestling, represented by over 185 schools.

Wrestling becomes the 11th sport to be sanctioned by the IGHSAU and the first since bowling was added in 2007. Iowa becomes the 34th state association to sanction girls wrestling.

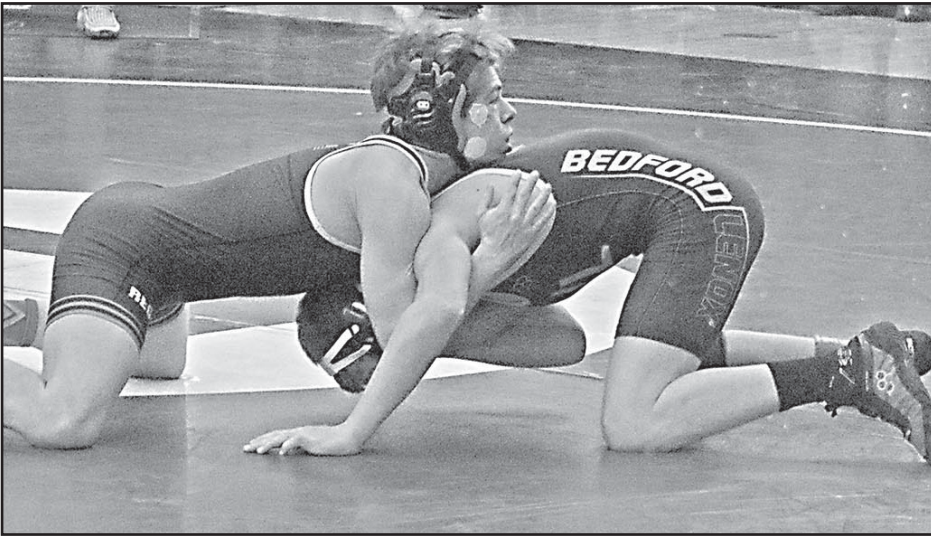

The Tigers fell to AHSTW by criteria, but went 6-5 in contested matches.

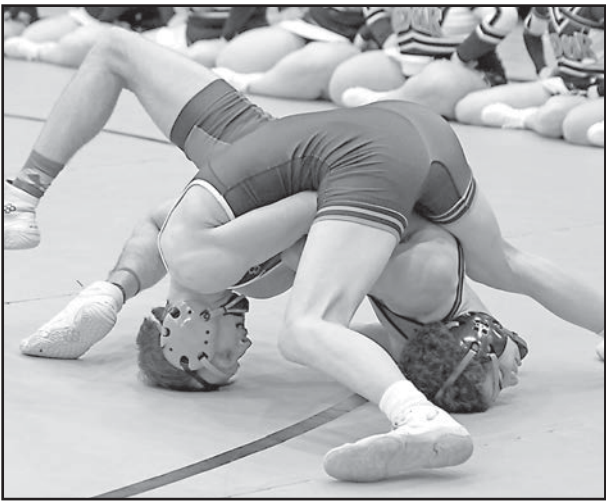

MONTGOMERY COUNTY SUPERVISORS MINUTES January 11, 2022

The Montgomery County Board of Supervisors met in quorum, Tuesday, January 11, 2022, at 8:30 a.m. at the courthouse for their regular meeting. The meeting was called to order by Chair Mark Peterson. There was a roll call of members with Supervisors Mark Peterson, Donna Robinson, Charla Schmid, Mike Olson present. Randy Cooper via zoom.

Motion to approve the agenda by Olson, second by Schmid. Roll call: Yes: Robinson, Schmid, Olson, Cooper, Peterson. No: None. Motion carried.

Minutes of the January 3, 2022, regular and organizational meeting and January 6, 2022, and January 7, 2022, budget work session were approved and stand as read. The Chairman called for public comments. There were none.

Under Supervisor's updates, Robinson attended a Landfill Meeting. Olson attended a Board of Adjustment Meeting and Planning & Zoning Meeting.

Wendy Mueller, West Central Community Executive Director, was present via zoom. She presented the annual report with a funding request of \$3,000 for FY 22/23. She would like to have the 28E agreement signed by the Chair. Supervisor Schmid is the representative for West Central Community and advocated on how important this program is to our community. The requested amount will be placed on the 22/23 budget.

Under Secondary Roads update, Engineer Karen Albert was present. She updated the Board on maintenance and projects.

Under Maintenance update, Dan Wright, Maintenance Director, was present. He updated the Board on general maintenance and projects. He also reported on the Clocktower and that Americlock was currently working on it.

Under new business, there was discussion on declaring Montgomery County as a Second Amendment Sanctuary County. Public comments were from Amanda Hill, Jerald Palmquist, Mike Luna, Glen Mason, and James Norris. Other public comments were via zoom from Rod Goodemote and Steve Turman. Supervisor Robinson read a statement from Jon Baker and Supervisor Peterson read a statement from Lt Col Ray Simmons. Assistant County Attorney, Bruce Swanson, was also present. Acting as legal counsel, he reiterated that passing a resolution isn't a bad idea and that it would be a symbolic statement. However, he didn't feel the word "Sanctuary" was necessary. Supervisor Schmid mentioned that 33 surrounding counties have already passed a similar resolution. Supervisor Olson stated that they aren't trying to change the laws, they just want to make a statement that Montgomery County wants to protect the Constitution and our residents' rights. Supervisor Robinson expressed concern and just because other counties are doing this doesn't mean Montgomery County has to. Supervisor Cooper

says he supports the Second Amendment but feels the word "Sanctuary" needs to be removed from the resolution. With much consideration, motion by Olson, second by Schmid to approve Resolution 22-6, Declaring Montgomery County to be a Second Amendment Sanctuary County and reads as follows:

"WHEREAS, the right of the people to keep and bear arms is guaranteed as an individual right under the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution, "A well-regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed." And "WHEREAS, the right of the people to keep and bear arms for the defense of life, liberty, and property is regarded as an inalienable right by the people of Montgomery County, Iowa; and

"WHEREAS, the people of Montgomery County, Iowa derive economic benefit from all safe forms of firearms recreation, hunting, and shooting conducted within Montgomery County using all types of firearms allowable under the United States Constitution and the laws of the State of Iowa; and

"WHEREAS, the Montgomery County Board of Supervisors was elected to represent the citizens of Montgomery County, and have sworn by their Oath of Office to uphold the United States Constitution and the Constitution of the State of Iowa; and

"WHEREAS, Iowa State Senators and State Representatives have also sworn by their

Oath of Office to uphold the United States Constitution and the Constitution of the State of Iowa; and

"WHEREAS, legislation is currently being considered and expected to be proposed by both the Iowa State legislature and Federal legislature that potentially seeks to infringe on the constitutionally protected right of citizens to keep and bear arms; and "WHEREAS, it is desirable to declare that Montgomery County is a Second Amendment Sanctuary County, as Montgomery County opposes the enactment of any legislation that would infringe upon the constitutional right of the people of Montgomery County to keep and bear arms.

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Montgomery County Board of Supervisors hereby declares Montgomery County to be a Second Amendment Sanctuary County, and hereby states its opposition to the enactment of any legislation that would infringe upon the constitutional right of the people of Montgomery County to keep and bear arms.

The above resolution was adopted by the Board of Supervisors of Montgomery County, Iowa, the vote thereon being as follows: Roll Call: Yes: Schmid, Olson, Peterson. No: Robinson, Cooper. Motion carried. The full resolution is located in the Auditor's Office.

Continued discussion took place of Montgomery County implementing a COVID-19 Vaccination, Testing & Face Covering Policy. Legal Counsel, Bruce Swanson, suggested that nothing should

be passed at this time and that the County should wait until the final ruling from the Supreme Court is heard. Supervisor Peterson agreed that the Board should wait for further information. He feels that with the statements that have been made by Governor Reynolds and Iowa OSHA, no action should be taken at this time. This item will continue to be on the agendas until then.

Motion by Robinson, seconded by Olson to approve Sheriff's Report of Fees for December 2021 in the amount of \$15,901.01. Roll Call: Yes: Schmid, Olson, Peterson, Robinson, Cooper. No: None. Motion carried.

Motion by Olson, seconded by Schmid to approve Recorder's Report of Fees for December 2021 in the amount of \$22,513.74. Roll Call: Yes: Olson, Peterson, Robinson, Cooper, Schmid. No: None. Motion carried.

Motion by Schmid, seconded by Robinson to approve claims payable Wednesday, January 12, 2022, in the amount of \$274,467.03. Roll Call: Yes: Peterson, Robinson, Cooper, Schmid, Olson. No: None. Motion carried.

Motion by Robinson, seconded Olson to approve tax transfer from Rural Service Basic to Secondary Roads for December 2021 in the amount of \$13,256.89. Roll Call: Yes: Cooper, Schmid, Olson, Peterson, Robinson. No: None. Motion carried.

Motion by Schmid, seconded by Cooper to approve tax transfer from General Service Basic to Secondary Roads for December 2021 in the amount

of \$747.18. Roll Call: Yes: Robinson, Cooper, Schmid, Olson, Peterson. No: None. Motion carried. Appointing representatives to boards and commissions was briefly discussed. 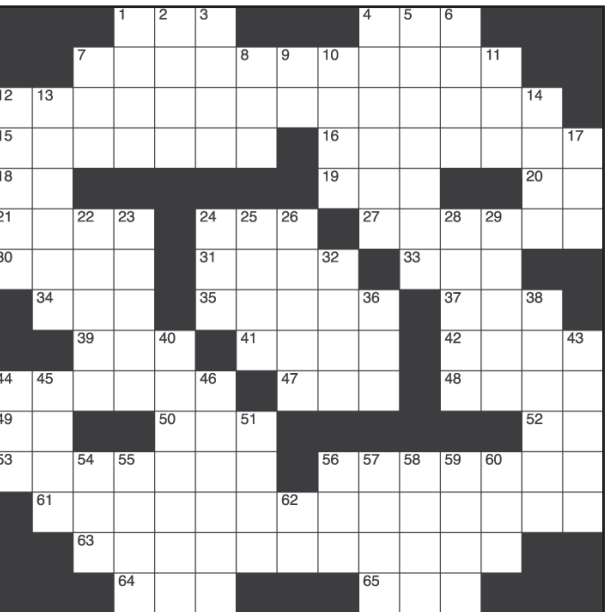
