Red Oak drops to Class 1A as state reclassifies FB

The IHSAA has released the preliminary classifications for football, with a few changes in our

coverage area. The biggest change is Red Oak football dropping to Class 1A from Class 2A.

Last year's record of 5-4 in Class 2A district 8, pitted Red Oak against five schools who remain in Class 2A, three who drop to Class 1A with Red Oak, and one remaining at Class A. The five schools staying at Class 2A are all in the top half of the enrollment criteria: Green County (1), Clarke (2), Des Moines Christian (4), Chariton (15), and

Clarinda (24). Red Oak has the third highest enrollment in Class 1A, with Shenandoah (10), West Central Valley (21), and Nodaway Valley (48), being the

three other teams dropping to Class 1A.

Riverside remains as a Class A school. "I think this is a good thing for Iowa High School football," Red Oak head football coach Michael Nordeen said. "It evens the playing field a little more in many ways. Our reclassification gives us an opportunity to compete with schools

of similar locations and sizes." Red Oak is in Class 1A district 8 along with AHSTW, Missouri Valley, Shenandoah, Treynor,

dozen letterwinners and numerous key returners," Nordeen said. "We had 56 young men sign up for the spring program and we are looking forward to continuing to build on the culture and standards that have been put into motion these past few years."

The reclassification and districts will remain for two years with the IHSAA reviewing at the end of

the 2024-2025 season. Southwest Valley competed in Class A district 7 last season. SWV will continue to be in Class A

district 7 for the next two years. Last season ended in round two of playoffs and the Timberwolves were 7-3. Two of the losses were to rival AHSTW, who will move up to Class 1A next season. Another team in their district from a year ago, Sidney, will drop to 8 player, leaving the remaining teams played last year in the same

This year, Class A district 7 will be AC/GC, Earlham, IKM-Manning, Panorama, Riverside,

South Central Calhoun, and Southwest Valley. The remaining four schools covered, Essex, Griswold, East Mills, and Stanton, were all in 8 player, district 9 last year with Essex joining Stanton as one team. East Mills finished the season 6-3 with a loss in the first round of playoffs. Stanton-Essex went 4-4 and Griswold 0-9. All



Red Oak school board continues plans for 2023-24 school year

The Red Oak School Board has finalized plans for the districts 2023-24 district calendar.

At the school board meeting March 15, a public hearing was held to receive feedback on the proposed calendar. No oral or written comments were received. Superintendent Ron Lorenz said the district had a committee of staff members that coordinated the calendar.

"We give them the state and local parameters that they have to abide by and make sure they check all the boxes when it comes to start dates and minimum hours. The calendar features 1,101.6 hours of instruction, which gives us around 21 hours for wiggle room for inclement weather. The start date begins Aug. 23, 2023, the earliest possible date we can start, and concludes on May 23, 2024, before Memorial Day," said Lorenz.

Christmas break was scheduled from Monday, Dec. 25, through Tuesday Jan. 2, and spring break for March 11. Lorenz said they were able to end school by Memorial Day by shortening early dis-

"We typically had a two-hour early dismissal on Wednesday afternoons. We have shortened that to a 90-minute early dismissal. That will be different for people, and they will have to be made aware, but that allows us to steal back some time to meet our minimum hourly requirements," advised Lorenz.

The board approved the calendar as presented.

The board also discussed participation in the Iowa K-5 OpenSciEd pilot project for both the 2023-24, and 2024-25 school years. Lorenz explained that board policy required approval of any experimental or pilot projects.

'This is something being offered through the State of Iowa and reflects a growing trend. There are a number of schools and universities looking for open

tional resources, of materials that already exist in print or on the internet, and compile a number of these resources to use as a curriculum," Lorenz advised. "Science curriculum is expensive and ever changing and is becoming somewhat superfluous in the sense that there's a lot of stuff out there."

The project was geared towards getting

teachers on board to vet the quality of the materials and compile them for use. Lorenz said the district would get training and instructional kits as part of signing up for the pilot, and two teachers at the elementary were interested in participating.

The board approved the district's participation in the Iowa K-5 OpenSciEd pilot project.

Lastly, the board discussed extending the OPAA Food Service Management contract through the 2023-24 school year. As per the contract stipulations, the board could review the contract on an annual basis. Lorenz said there would be a slight increase in prices.

"Lunch will increase in price by 28 cents, and breakfast will increase 19 cents. both of those increases are well within the stateprescribed limits, and we are recommending renewal," Lorenz stated.

The board agreed to extend the OPAA Food Service Management contract through the 2023-24 school year.

In other business, the board:

- Approved the repair of the district's wheelchair accessible bus at Precision Diesel, at a cost of \$8,363. Lorenz advised the district as it was the only bus the district had with a wheelchair lift, repairs were necessary to keep it operational.
