## Red Oak girls eke out a team, drop inaugural soccer match

The Red Oak JV girls soccer team had its first match of the year against Atlantic, falling 5-0 in the Tigers' first ever girls match.

"We only had about three girls who had ever played soccer before," Red Oak head girls soccer coach Ed Young said.

The Tigers allowed two rapid goals before settling down, but Coach Young said once the jitters were out, the girls played like a team.

"They were using good defense and offense," Young said. "We had no subs and the girls played the whole game. At the end of the game, I was proud of each and every one of them because they played their hearts out and gave it their all."

The team took on Tri-Center on Tuesday, April 11, in Neola, followed by the Red Oak JV boys soccer team debut.

Tiger girls fell 4-0 to Tri-Center. "The girls had only 11 players, with no substitutes, and held the Trojans 0-0 until the last 10 minutes of the first half when one of our best players sustained an ankle injury and had to be taken off the field for evaluation," Young said. "The Trojan's coach played one-man down to equal the number of players on the field for the second half. The girls played hard and scrappy, making us all proud of them."

Tiger boys played a very talented Tri-Center team, falling 5-2.

"We played very well the first half with a 0-0 tie at halftime," Red Oak head boys soccer coach Mark Kells said. "I am extremely proud

of how our team came out and competed today under the circumstances."

Brandon Hernandez scored both of the Tiger goals and led the team with seven shots on goal.

Kevin Rodriguez had four shots on goal, but was unable to find the back of the net to keep the pressure on.

Joshua LeRette and Ty Jenkins had one shot each.

"Tyler Rinabarger started in goal and had a great game," Kells said. "Landon Gigstad finished in goal and between both goalies, they had 15 saves for the game."

Red Oak hosts St. Albert on Thursday, April 20, with the girls beginning at 4:30 p.m. and the boys game to follow.

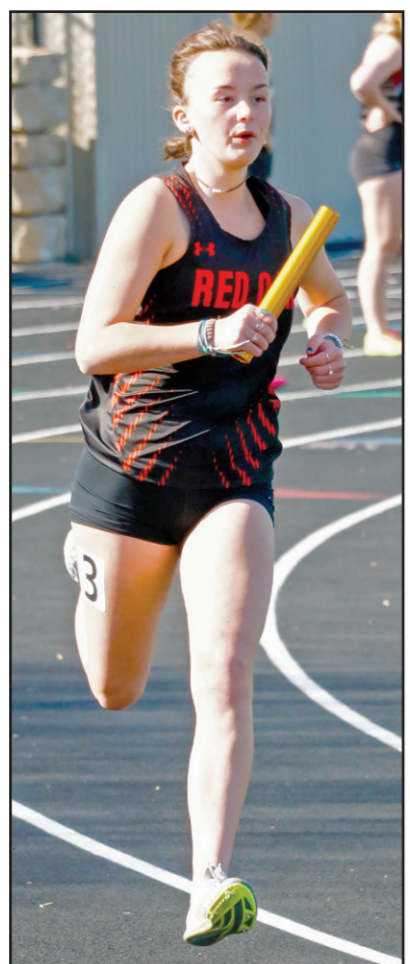

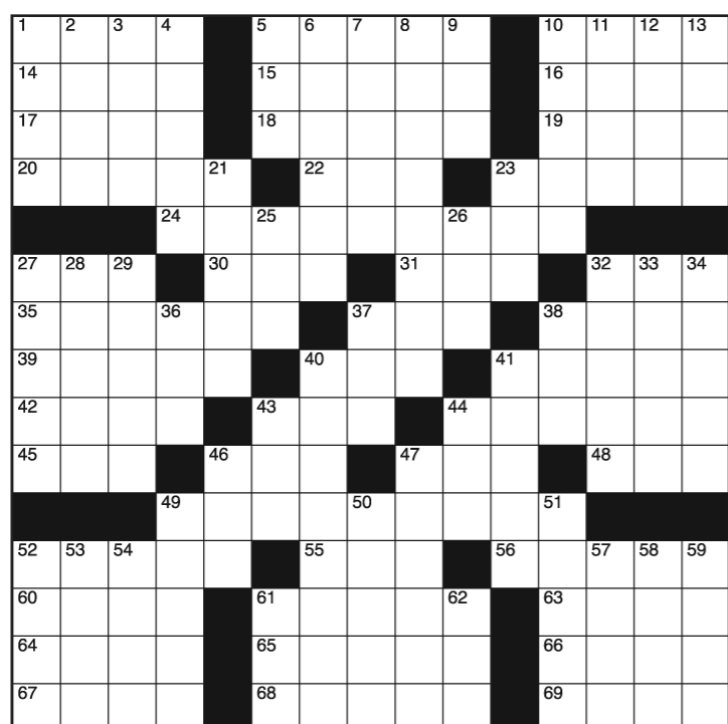
