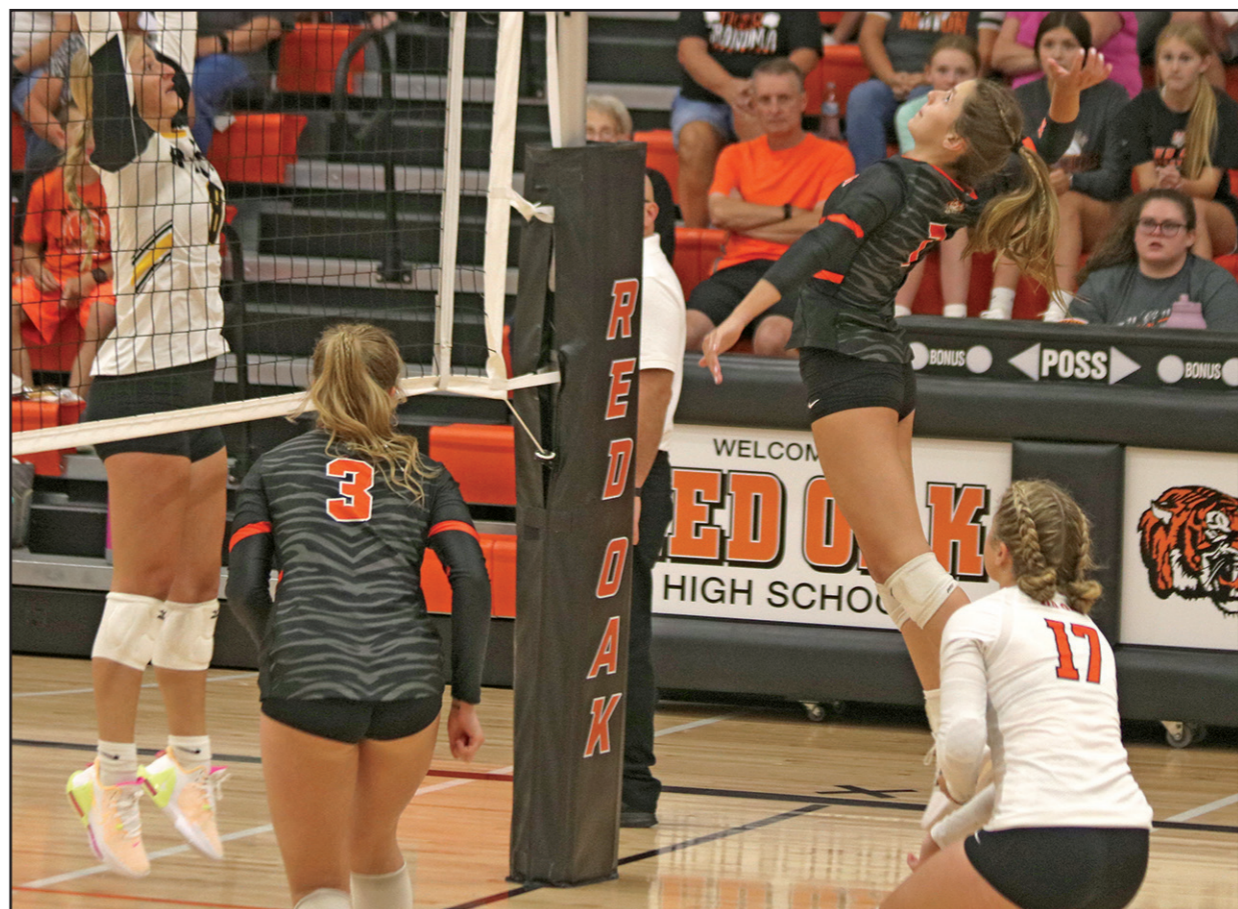

Tiger volleyball opened conference action at home on Tuesday, Aug. 30, defeating Atlantic 3-1 with set scores of 25-20, 21-25, 25-14, 25-17. Red Oak began on a 2-0 run and held

the lead the entire first set, pulling away from the back-and-forth battle once they reached 19-16.

In the second set, the Tigers jumped out to a 5-0 start with two aces landed by Olivia Bozwell in her first five serves. However, Atlantic quickly answered on a 4-0 run of their own and took their

first lead of the night at 9-8. Red Oak knotted the score twice but were unable to pull ahead, ending the second set tied at one.

The third set was all Red Oak as they gained control from the start and never looked back.

The fourth set became the final set as

the Tigers never let the Trojans get any closer than three points.

Tiger football nabs win, begins season 2-0

Class 2A ninth ranked Red Oak defeated West Central Valley 42-0 to begin the season 0-2.

"The boys are on a mission, and West Central Valley was just in their way on Friday," Red Oak head football coach Michael Nordeen said. "This team is built differently and has something to prove."

And the statement was made almost immediately as the game got underway. Jack Kling intercepted a pass on the Wildcats' third play of the game to give the Tigers possession that ended with a field goal by Dawson Bond and a 3-0 lead.

"The defense came out and played lights out again," Nordeen said.

Kyler Rinaburger intercepted a pass on the next Wildcats drive to set up a TD pass from Chase Roeder to Bond. After a successful PAT by Bond, the Tigers extended the lead 10-0.

The Tiger defense forced a Wildcat punt on their next drive, and capitalized in the end zone once again on a Roeder to Bond 65-yard connection. Riley Fouts sprinted into the end zone for the conversion and the Tigers pulled away 18-0 with just over nine minutes remaining to the half.

Red Oak defense once again forced a Wildcat punt, and the Tigers took over possession. The Tigers executed a beautiful hook and ladder (Roeder to Braden Woods to Fouts) which set up a Fouts TD run. With just two minutes remaining in the first half, Red Oak held a 24-0 lead. But the Tigers were not ready to quit as Landon Couse intercepted a pass with just seconds remaining in



the first half, giving the Tigers just one more play. That's all they needed as Roeder handed the rock to Fouts, who ran 80 yards for another TD. The Tigers converted for two points and led 32-0 at the break.

Red Oak began second half play with possession, but a fumble turned the ball over to the Wildcats. Red Oak defense once again stood tall and forced another punt.

Three plays later, Jack Schmadeke ran in for a Tiger TD and Red Oak extended the lead to 39-0 with just over four minutes left in the 3Q, and headed into continuous clock play.

Schmadeke claimed a pass early in the fourth quarter and the Tigers capitalized with a field goal for the 42-0 final score.

Red Oak's Roeder went 7/11 for 136 yards and two TDs and had five carries for 30 yards in the win.

Fouts led the ground game with 295 yards on 22 carries for two TDs, while Bond was the air target, finishing with two catches for 82 yards and two TDs.

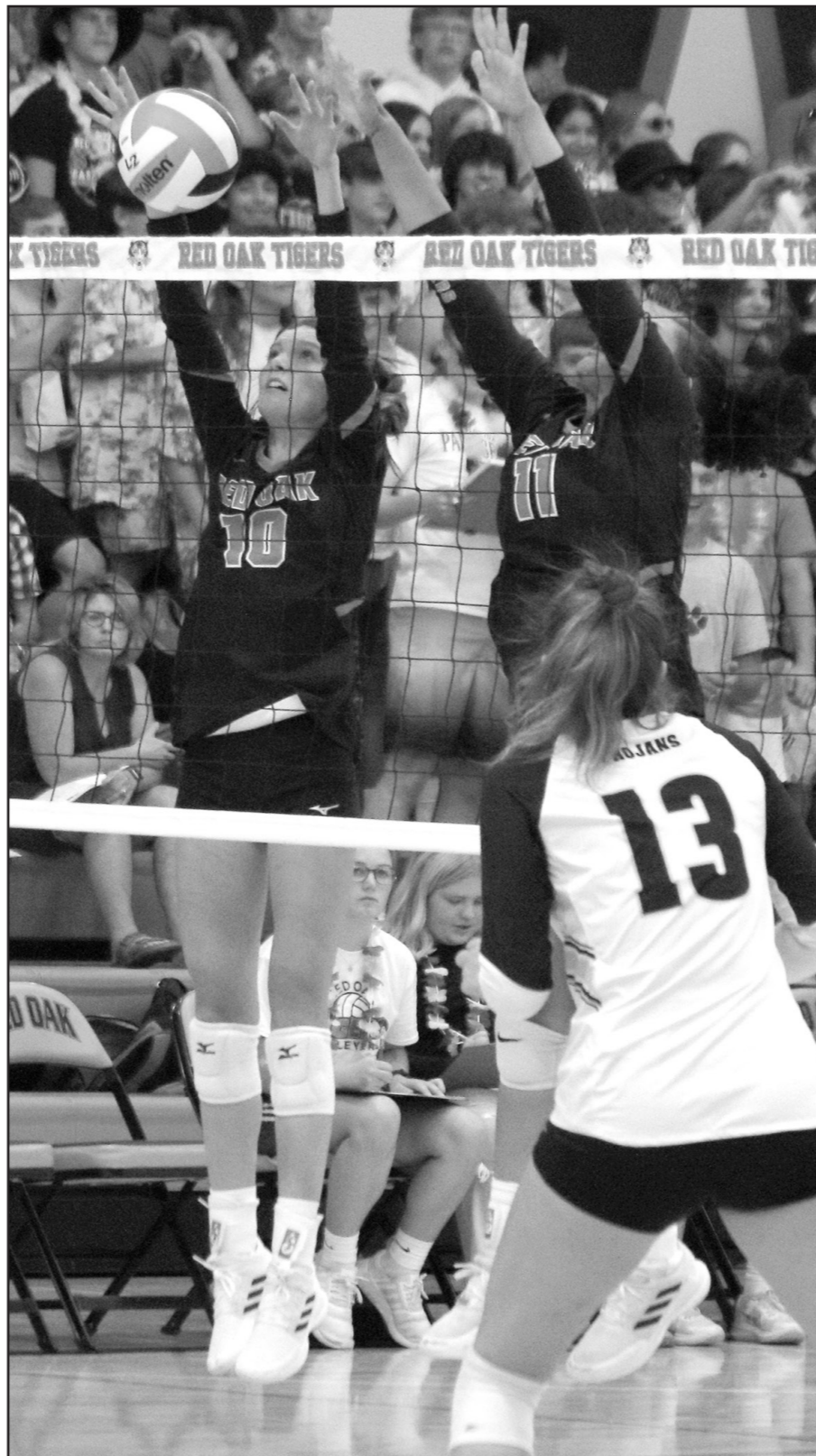

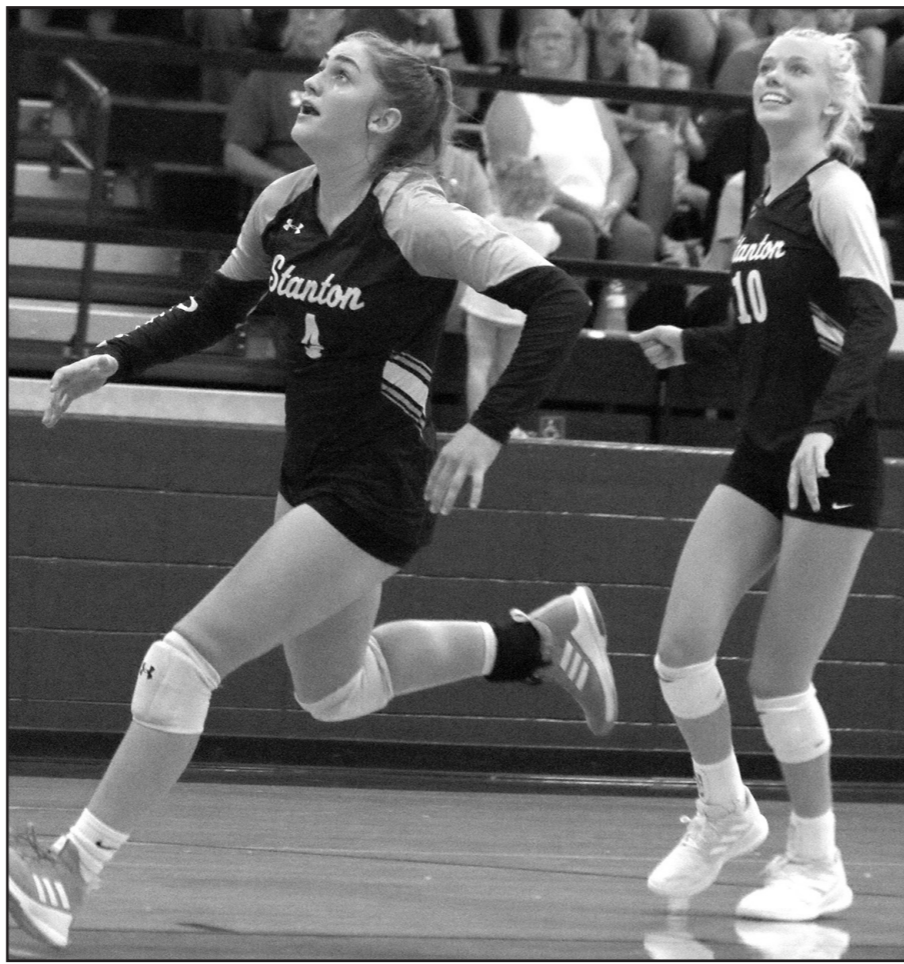
Set one was back and forth throughout the set, but Sidney put together small runs while Stanton could only get one point at a time most of the way.

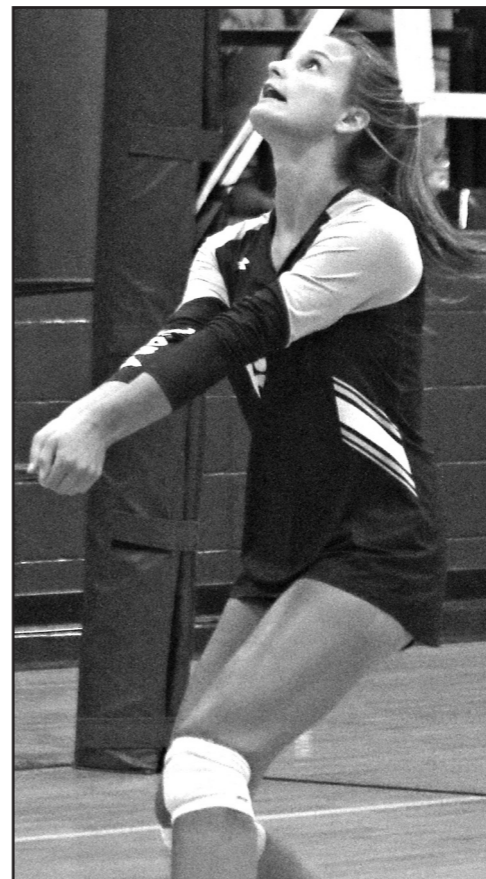
The fourth set found Stanton dominating and winning with a block at the net to set up the tie-breaker, where the momentum shifted to Sidney once again in the all out dominant win.

T'wolves trample Sidney in district FB

The Southwest Valley football team traveled to Sidney on Friday, Sept. 2, to open Class A-7 action, and came home the victors in a 35-0 contest.

Southwest Valley's QB, Evan Timmerman, threw an interception on the opening drive, but the Timberwolf defense kept the Cowboys out of the end zone and Timmerman made up for the error by putting six points on the board with a 43-yard touchdown run on the next possession. Southwest Valley defense stood tall all night as they forced three punts on

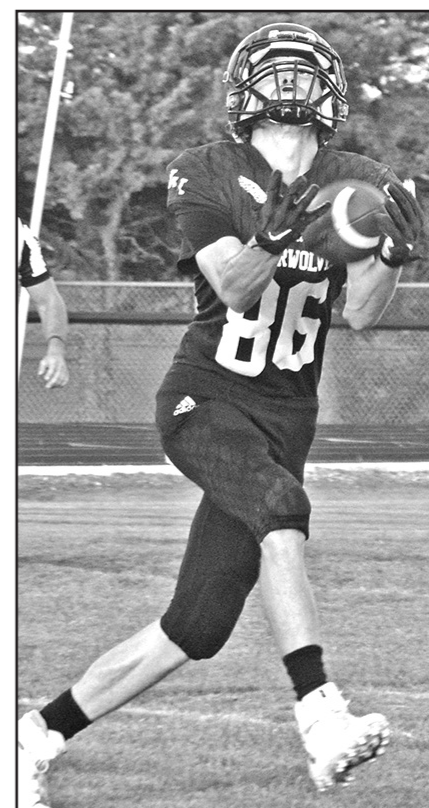
